FREESKATING CLARIFICATION WELL BALANCED PROGRAMMES

Just a reminder of the new clarification bought in by CIPA for 2015 international long programmes. This also applies in New Zealand to our domestic competitions for the international grades.

Spins MUST be evenly distributed throughout the program, this means that between at Least two spin elements in the long program there should be minimum two other different Elements (at least one step sequence and one jump element).

Correct example: Spin element – Jump element – Step Sequence – Spin element – Spin Element. A deduction of 0.5 in general will be deducted by the referee in the B mark for a program that is Not well- balanced.
